Research news:

Book publication: Politics, Theology, Literature and Gender Identities in the Public Sphere and Education (Spyridoula Athanasopoulou-Kypriou, ArmosPublications)

The book highlights a social and political theology that does not remain detached from society and its challenges. On the contrary, it is tested and transformed when it encounters culture, with its diverse expressions and the identities that it sometimes embraces, sometimes (re)shapes, and sometimes excludes. Through this encounter, the tensions, possibilities, and limitations of theological discourse in the public sphere are revealed.



24-26/04 : 1st Panhellenic Conference of the D.P.E. of Rethymno “Building Learning Together. Cultivating the Future in the Classroom”

The Directorate of Primary Education of Rethymno, in collaboration with educational institutions and local government authorities, organized a major conference on educational innovation, inclusion, critical thinking, and the use of digital technologies and Artificial Intelligence in education. The conference was addressed to teachers, researchers, university students, and education professionals, focusing on contemporary issues related to democratic education and active citizenship, inclusion and the protection of rights, psychosocial support and the development of life skills, education for sustainability, creativity, arts and culture, as well as the integration of digital technologies and Artificial Intelligence into the educational process.

08-10/05: Conference of the Hellenic Association of Environmental Education (PEEKPE) “Environmental Education/Education for Sustainability in the 21st-Century School: Pathways-Shifts-Transformations”



Our Department, in collaboration with the Environmental Education Centres (KEPEA) of Crete, organized the 9th Conference of the Hellenic Association of Environmental Education (PEEKPE).



The conference included 198 presentations and two workshops, was held both in person and online, and was organized under the auspices of the University of Crete. The Department's Science Education Laboratory participated with eight oral presentations, while the Chair of the Department, Professor Dimitris Stavrou, was one of the invited speakers, delivering a keynote lecture entitled “The European Perspective on Climate Change Education.”

New Repository “The Fedoras Teacher Academy”

The FEDORAS Teacher Academy, in which the Department's Science Education Laboratory (EDTHE) has an active and substantial role, announced the launch of its new digital repository. The repository provides a rich collection of teaching resources on Interdisciplinarity and Sustainability in educational practice, as well as significant research materials produced by the research team of the Science Education Laboratory (EDTHE).



11-17/05: 7th International Conference of the “Odysseus 2000-2026” Programme entitled “Artificial Intelligence-eLearning-eCreativity”.



The Laboratory of Advanced Learning Technologies in Lifelong and Distance Education (EDIVEA) organized the conference for the seventh consecutive year, highlighting contemporary approaches and innovative practices that connect Artificial Intelligence, distance education, and creativity within the context of lifelong learning. The conference programme included experiential workshops held on site at the University of Crete's Rethymno Campus, as well as keynote lectures that were livestreamed online. Participation was free of charge for teachers, university students, and anyone interested, providing a broad audience with the opportunity to attend the conference proceedings and become informed about contemporary developments in the field of education.

15-17/05: Successful Participation of our Department in the 6th Panhellenic Conference on Cognitive Psychology of the Hellenic Psychological Society (ELPSE)



As part of the conference, entitled “Cognitive Psychology at the Crossroads of the Mind Sciences,” the invited Symposium of the Division of Developmental Psychology, entitled “Innate Intersubjectivity: Studies on the Cognitive, Social, and Emotional Development of Infants,” was held under the chairmanship of Associate Professor Vasiliki Tsourtou. The symposium focused on the importance of early infant-caregiver interactions for cognitive, social, and emotional development, highlighting the crucial role of early intersubjective experiences in shaping the infant’s developmental trajectory.

29/05-01/06: Successful Completion of the 20th International Conference “The Child and the Book” entitled “Diaspora(s), Exile, Nomads, and Children’s Literature”



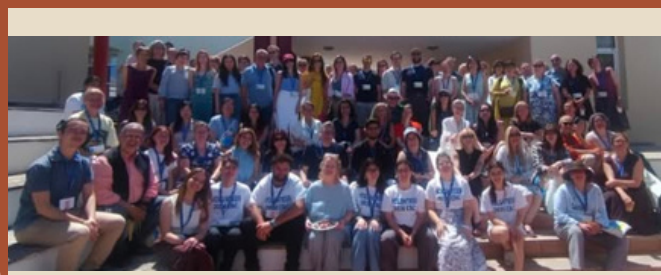
The International Conference was successfully completed with great success and significant international impact. The conference, one of the leading international scientific events in the field of Children’s and Young Adult Literature, was co-organized by the Department of Primary Education of the University of Crete and the Department of Primary Education of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens, and was hosted at the Gallos Campus in Rethymno, from 29 May to 1 June 2026.

Approximately 200 participants from 30 countries -professors, researchers, postdoctoral fellows, and doctoral candidates- engaged in a fruitful dialogue on literature, diaspora, exile, population mobility, cultural memory, and intercultural education. These themes were also addressed by the distinguished invited speakers, Professors Petros Panaou (USA/Cyprus) and Mateusz Świątlicki (Poland), as well as the award-winning illustrator Chryso Charalambous (Cyprus). The exhibition of works by Greek illustrators at the Central Library of the University of Crete, organized in collaboration with the Greek Children’s Book Circle – Greek Section of IBBY, also received particular attention. The exhibition was designed by the Head of Archives Preservation and and Rare Books of the University of Crete Library, Niki Petraki, was curated by Assistant Professor of the Department of Primary Education of the University of Crete, Vasiliki Vasiloudi, and introduced by the President of the Greek Section of IBBY and distinguished author Vangelis Iliopoulos.

Our Department specifically participated with the following presentations:

- The Book, the Ship and the Butterfly: Surviving in Diaspora with Abstract Picturebooks (Vassiliki Vasiloudi & Viktoria de Rijke)
- Love, Communion, and Power: Postcolonial and Feminist Re-readings of The Little Prince in Religious Education (Spyridoula Athanasopoulou-Kypriou)
- Metacognition and Creative Thinking: a Dynamic Relationship and its Impact on Creative Writing (Irin Gaki & Giannis Spantidakis)

The contribution of the co-organizers, Assistant Professor Vasiliki Vasiloudi (University of Crete) and Professor Gina Kalogirou (National and Kapodistrian University of Athens), was crucial, as was the support provided by the University Authorities, the Holy Metropolis of Rethymno, the Municipality of Rethymno, the Deans of the Schools of Education of the University of Crete and the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens, the Heads of the Departments of Primary Education of both universities, and the volunteer team of the Department of Primary Education of the University of Crete. The successful completion of an international event of such scope highlights the potential of collaborations between Greek universities and confirms their leading role in the international scientific dialogue, the production of new knowledge, and the promotion of academic outreach. At the same time, it reaffirms the dynamic nature of Children’s Literature as a field of academic research that engages with contemporary social and educational challenges, strengthening international academic networking.



22-24/06: Successful Participation of the Department in the 5th International Conference on Technology and Innovation in Learning, Teaching and Education (TECH-EDU2026)



PhD candidate Christina Smaropoulou presented the research paper entitled “The ARIELS Islands: Designing an AI-Enhanced LMS for Social and Emotional Learning and Self-Regulated Learning”, which was conducted under the scientific supervision of Assistant Professor Aikaterini Vasiou, Professor Ioannis Spantidakis, and Associate Professor of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens Georgios Koutroumanos. The paper focused on the design of an innovative Learning Management System that leverages Artificial Intelligence to enhance social and emotional learning and self-regulated learning in Primary Education.

STEPS-Science for Growth: Empowering Minds

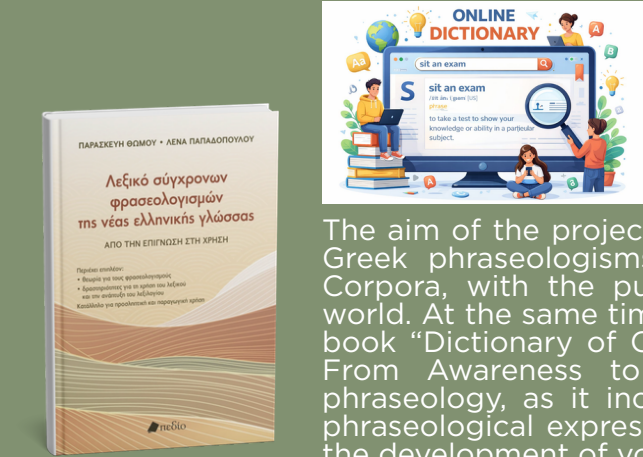
STEPS – Science for Growth: Empowering Minds is a European project funded by the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA) under Horizon Europe, aiming to bring science closer to society. Through activities addressed to researchers, educators, university students, and citizens, it creates opportunities for dialogue, collaboration, and engagement around science, research, and learning. At the core of the project lies the philosophy of the Growth Mindset, which highlights the importance of continuous learning, effort, and collaboration in developing knowledge and skills. Within the framework of STEPS,

At the same time, the Centre for Training and Lifelong Learning (KEDIVIM) of the University of Crete organizes the free online training programme “Growth Mindset in

Online and Printed Dictionary of Contemporary Phraseological Expressions (Scientific Coordinator: Associate Professor Paraskevi Thomou)



The research project “Online Dictionary of Greek Phraseologisms (OnDiPhra)” is being implemented in our Department by a research team of the Laboratory for the Study of Language and Literature in Education (EMEGLO) (Scientific Coordinator: Paraskevi Thomou; research team: Lena Papadopoulou, Christos Christodoulakis, Vasia Tsami, Giorgos Vavourakis).

The aim of the project is the development of an online pedagogical dictionary of Greek phraseologisms, based on authentic linguistic material from Electronic Corpora, with the purpose of supporting students learning Greek around the world. At the same time, Paraskevi Thomou and Lena Papadopoulou published the book “Dictionary of Contemporary Phraseological Expressions of Modern Greek: From Awareness to Use”, which constitutes a reference book on Greek phraseology, as it includes phraseological theory, a dictionary containing 1,500 phraseological expressions, as well as activities for the use of the dictionary and the development of vocabulary.

25-27/06: Successful Participation of EMEGLO lab. in the International ARLE/IFTE Conference 2026 (The Unbounded Journey: The Teaching of First Language, Literacy, and Literature in a Dynamic World)



EMEGLO participated in the conference with the online presentation “Bridging In-School and Out-of-School Literacy Practices: A Case Study in Greek Primary Education” (Assistant Professor Vasia Tsami, postgraduate student Anastasia Mountoufari, and Associate Professor Paraskevi Thomou). The presentation showcased a case study on the mismatching between students’ in-school and out-of-school literacy practices and was implemented within the framework of the project “Bridging In-School and Out-of-School Literacy Practices: A useful online toolkit for the teacher,” which is part of the INGENIUM-funded programme.



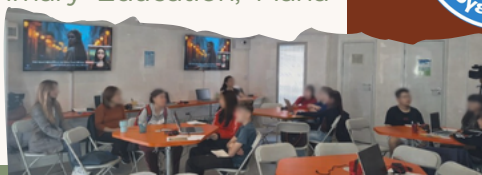
Activities and events:



03/04: The volunteer group of the Department of Primary Education **“Noiazomai kai Dro” (“I Care and Act”)** carried out, on 23 March, an activity involving the creation of Easter candles for the children of SOS Children’s Villages, in collaboration with participants from the Day Care Centres for the Elderly (KAPI). The activity was completed with the delivery of the candles to a representative of SOS Children’s Villages on Friday, 3 April.



20/04: An **experiential workshop** was held in Heraklion for 1st-year middle school students on the topic of **the connection between art and artificial intelligence in education**, as part of an activity organized by **“The Smile of the Child”** with the scientific support of the Department of Primary Education of the University of Crete. The workshop was implemented by PhD candidates of the Department of Primary Education, Maria Assariotaki and Christina Smaropoulou, under the supervision of Professor Eleni Vasilaki and Assistant Professor Aikaterini Vasiou, with the participation of 10 students who utilized AI tools for creative activities and the development of emotional and social skills.



05/05: **“The Right to Education: The Case of Migrant and Refugee Children”** was the topic of a **one-day event** organized with the aim of highlighting the equal access of all children to education. The event was co-organized by the **Laboratory for Intercultural and Migration Studies (EDIAMME-CEME)** of the University of Crete, **the Centre for Children’s Rights** of the University of Crete, and the **Directorate of Primary Education of the Regional Unit of Rethymno**. The event was coordinated by Professor of the Department of Primary Education and Director of EDIAMME Aspasia Chatzidaki, while welcoming remarks were delivered by the President of the Centre for Children’s Rights, Maria Kyriotaki, and the President of the Department of Primary Education.



09/05: The Laboratory for the Study of Language and Literature in Education (EMEGLO) participated in the **TEDx University of Crete - Ithaka 2026 event**. The organizers (Vasia Tsami, Nikoleta Panagaki, with Eva Voskaki, Anastasia Mountoufaris, and Maria Tzortzi as coordinators) invited participants to explore whether elements of racism and anti-racism coexist in primary school language textbooks, through the **experiential workshop “Education and Racism: Charting the Path towards the Ithaka of Equality”**.

10/05: The group of students, within the framework of the course **“Art Expression”** under the supervision of Kostas Christidis, member of the Teaching Staff (E.E.P.) of the Department of Primary Education, in collaboration with the Parents and Guardians Association of the **2nd Primary School of Rethymno**, organized an activity based on social

and participatory practices with the theme **“Social Sculpture and Artistic Activism”**. The activity was based on the principles of social sculpture, according to which art functions as a means of collective intervention and social transformation, fostering citizen participation, solidarity, and community engagement.



11/05: The Volunteer Group **“Noiazomai kai Dro” (“I Care and Act”)**, in collaboration with the **Hellenic Red Cross**, organized a free **First Aid Training Seminar**.

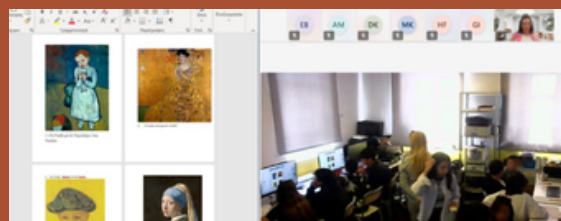
11-20/05: **“The Smile of the Child”**, in collaboration with the **Region of Crete** and the **EDIVEA lab.**, carried out a **tour across the Regional Unit of Rethymno** featuring prevention and awareness-raising activities, educational programmes, preventive medical examinations, first aid seminars, psychosocial support, and creative activities for children and families.



May: The **Positive Parenting Programme for Parents with Infants aged 0-12 months (Triple P – Positive Parenting – Babies)** was successfully completed in Chania. The programme was implemented in collaboration with the **Counselling Centre of the Municipality of Chania** (Responsible Psychologist: Aik. Malandraki) and **our Department** (Coordinator: V. Tsourtou, Associate Professor of Developmental Psychology). The programme (University of Queensland, Australia) is implemented in Greece by **UNICEF** in collaboration with the **Ministry of Health**. The aim of the programme is to provide psychological support to participants during their transition into the role of parenthood. We warmly thank the mothers who participated in the programme and wish them to experience parenthood in the way they desire!



In May, our Department implemented an online activity in support of the **Greek School of Imbros** entitled **“Social and Emotional Learning through Art and Artificial Intelligence”**. The activity involved 12 students and teachers of the school, with the aim of connecting art and artificial intelligence in education and fostering social and emotional skills. Through interactive activities and the use of artificial intelligence tools, the children creatively expressed their emotions and experiences. The activity was implemented by PhD candidate Christina Smaropoulou, under the guidance of Professor Eleni Vasilaki and Assistant Professor Aikaterini Vasiou.

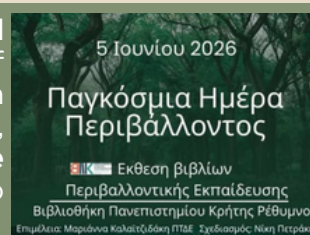
